Due to the absence of the Chairman Cllr Tripp chaired the meeting

Chairman announced there had been applications for the two vacancies on the Parish Council and both would be invited to attend the next meeting in July

A new waste bin was agreed which would be installed by the Borough Council to be sited in the new play area.

It was confirmed a new contractor had taken over the grass cutting in the playing fields and draft contract would be drawn up for Councillors to consider.

Japanese Knotweed found in the allotments had been sprayed and this would be an ongoing treatment until it had been eradicated. There would be an inspection of the allotments in June by Cllr Mrs Smith and Cllr D Stones

Crime report

The Annual Return for 2013/14 was agreed and signed by the Chairman for the audit on 9<sup>th</sup> June

Councillors met with the proprietor of Where Memories Meet to discuss proposals for a license to sell alcohol, live music and late night closing.

Charles Stroud reported on Speedwatch - 186 observations for the month of May and information passed to Kent Police, who identified 27 had previously been speeding across the county. 24 of these for the second time, 3 for the third time and 8 for excessive speed (at or above 45mph) Letters would be sent by police to the registered owners accompanied by Speed awareness advice.

Kent Police had also given details of Enforcement Operations to be held in the village

John Ibbs reported on the success of the fete on 1<sup>st</sup> June. The weather was very good and a large number of people attended. The condition of the field for the day was very good and a number of people had commented on its improvement. Thanks were given to all those who work hard before and on the day. It was stressed that despite requests in Rostrum no one from the village came forward to help. Bearing this in mind it would depend if the Fields Association would agree to hold another fete next year.

John Ibbs had also presented his report as Village Warden and went on to give details of his role. He works 12 hours per week, monitoring the playing fields, Glebe Meadow and other property owned by the parish. He stated the job had expanded over the years. There continued to be a problem with dog fouling. He was able through his experience with other youth organisations to deal with any reported incidents with the youth in the village. He said residents could call him any time, he stated he receives a number of calls over a month and although he would deal with minor problems he could not get involved with criminal activity and this would be reported to the police. He would attend Parish Council meetings on a quarterly basis together with a report. The Chairman thanked John for all his work on behalf of the village. It was agreed to look into the role of Community Wardens.

There are no vacancies in the allotments.

Cllr D Stones said he would do some research in what was involved in producing a Local Plan

Cllr Marks reported there had been no further information on the future of the station signal box to date.

Members of the public reported overgrown vegetation

A member of the public thanked all those who had worked on the fete.
